In James 1:1, we are given two major considerations:

- 1. We are told about the one who is writing the book.
- 2. We are told about the ones who are reading the book.

In the New Testament four James are mentioned:

- 1. James, the father of Judas, (not Iscariot) (Lu 6:16)
- 2. James, the son of Alphaeus.
- 3. James, the son of Zebedee.

The writer of the Book of James: <u>James</u>, the half-brother of <u>Jesus</u>.

All the way to the cross James <u>did not believe</u>. that Jesus was the Messiah.. What changed? <u>I Corinthians 15</u>
James was converted to Christ following Jesus' resurrection appearance to him.

Facts about James:

- 1. He became pastor of the Jerusalem church.
- He was the <u>presiding officer</u> over the very prestigious Jerusalem council in Acts 15.
- 3. The apostle Paul calls him one of the <u>pillars of the early church</u> in Galatians 1:19 along with Peter and John. 4.
- 4. He was the one who <u>received the offering</u> brought by the Apostle Paul from the Gentile churches to help the poverty stricken saints of the Jerusalem church.
- 5. He was very familiar with Jesus' teachings...

What was James' nickname? Old camel knees.

How did James introduce himself? A servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ. (Js 1:1a)

Who is James addressing the letter to? James is primarily writing to the \underline{be} lievers of the twelve tribes of Israel scattered abroad.
