"Fill 'er Up" Ephesians 5:18 February 7, 2016

Five observations from our text:

#1. There seems to be a direct <u>parallel</u> drawn between being <u>drunk</u> with <u>wine</u> and being filled with the Spirit.

Question: What comparison can we make between wine

the Spirit?

Answer: Influence or control

#2. The phrase "to be filled with the Spirit" is a command.

#3. The phrase "to be filled with the Spirit" is in the <u>present tense</u>.

#4. The phrase "to be filled with the Spirit" is in the <u>passive tense</u>.

Two conclusions from this truth:

1. The Holy Spirit is <u>ready</u> and <u>willing</u> to fill us at any <u>moment.</u>

2. We must make ourselves available to Him.

#5. The phrase "to be filled with the Spirit" is a <u>plural command.</u>

What does it mean "to be filled with the Spirit"? It means to be under the <u>influence</u> and <u>control</u> of the Holy Spirit. It means that the Holy Spirit has controlling influence in your life.

What prevents the Holy Spirit from filling you? YOU

NOTE: Being filled with the Spirit does not mean I have more of the Spirit it means the Spirit has more of me.

Question: How are we filled with the Holy Spirit? (Remember these two things):

- 1. Empty out
- 2. Open up
