"Becoming An Effective Witness" John 1:19-34 February 1, 2015

Point #1: To be an effective witness for Jesus, <u>you need to be clear on who you are not.</u> (v.19-21) *Interrogation of John the Baptist:* 1st Question: <u>"Who are you?"</u> Answer: <u>"I am not the Christ."</u> 2nd Question: <u>"Are you Elijah?"</u> Answer: <u>"I am not."</u> 3rd Question: <u>"Are you the Prophet?"</u> Answer: "No."

Point #2: To be an effective witness for Jesus, <u>you need to know who you are.</u> (v. 22-24) Point #3: To be an effective witness for Jesus, <u>you must point people to J</u>esus. (v. 25-34)

Question: How could a Gentile convert to Judaism in Bible times?

(Three Requirements)

- 1. You had to <u>receive instruction</u> by the scribes.
- 2. You had to be <u>circumcised</u> if you were a male.
- 3. You had to be <u>baptized</u> in a <u>ritualistic cleaning</u> that spoke about you leaving your old way of life and becoming a citizen of the Jewish community.

As a witness, what does John the Baptist tell us about Jesus in verses 25-34?

- 1. He speaks of the greatness of Jesus. (v. 26-28)
- 2. He speaks of the <u>coming sacrifice</u> of Jesus. (v.29)
- 3. He speaks about the <u>pre-existence</u> of Jesus. (v.30)
- 4. He speaks about the filling and empowering of Jesus. (v.31-33)
- 5. He speaks about the <u>deity</u> of Jesus. (v.34)
