- Lesson #1: Parents must <u>resist passivity</u> and <u>remain active</u> in their child's life.
- Lesson #2: Parents must avoid, at all costs <u>showing favoritism</u> to one of their children.
- Lesson #3: No response is <u>more cruel</u> than jealousy.
