"Taming the Tongue" James 3:1-12 May 18, 2014

Three important truths about the tongue:

Truth #1: The tongue is <u>extremely powerful</u>. (v.3, 4)
Two illustrations to support this truth:

- 1. The bit in the horse's mouth. (v.3)
- 2. The <u>rudder</u> of a <u>ship</u> (v.4)

Truth #2: The tongue is <u>incredibly destructive</u>. (v.5-8)
Two illustrations to support this truth:

- 1. A <u>fire</u> in a <u>forest</u>. (v.5, 6)
- 2. A wild animal. (v.7, 8)

Truth #3: The tongue can be <u>ruthlessly deceptive</u>. (v. 9-12)
Two illustrations to support this truth:

1. A spring of <u>fresh</u> <u>water</u> and <u>salt</u> <u>water</u>. (v.11)

2. A fig tree bearing olives. (v.12)

Why does a Bible teacher fall under a stricter judgment? Three Reasons:

A Bible teacher is responsible to speak the truth, not personal opinion.

What a Bible teacher says $\underline{\text{affects lives}}$. (2 Timothy 2:15)

A Bible teacher is expected to live the truth not just teach it.
